

CIVIL ENGINEER COLLEGIATE PROGRAM (CEC)

Award:

Up to 36 months prior to graduation, **receive a monthly stipend of \$2,735 - \$3,111 until graduation.** Only requirements while in school is to maintain GPA. While enrolled in program, **receive complete Medical/Dental coverage.**

Scholarship Overview:

Technical majors such as mathematics, science and engineering are highly desired, but students in most curricular are eligible for CEC.

To apply for the Navy's CEC, you must:

- Be a U.S. Citizen;
- Be at least 18 but not more than 34 before degree completion. (Most officer programs have lower age requirements.);
- Meet Navy physical standards;
- Have a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of at least 2.7 on a 4.0 scale (3.5+ is competitive for acceptance);

If you're selected for the CEC, you must:

- Maintain a minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA.
- Report your college grades to the Commander, Navy Recruiting Command after completing each semester or quarter;
- Complete requirements for a bachelor's degree according to a previously approved degree completion plan.

After earning your bachelor's degree in CEC, you'll be enrolled in the next available Officer Candidate School (OCS) class in Pensacola, Florida. Classes last about 13 weeks. Upon successful completion of OCS, you'll be commissioned an officer in the Naval Reserve. As a selectee, your service obligation is four years of active duty.

Pay/Benefits:

After graduation, **\$50,000+ a year starting... \$60,000+ after two years ... \$80,000+ after 4 years. Full Dental/Medical coverage.** We pay for all moving expenses. Eligible for GI bill, receive over \$1000 a month year round for graduate degree.
